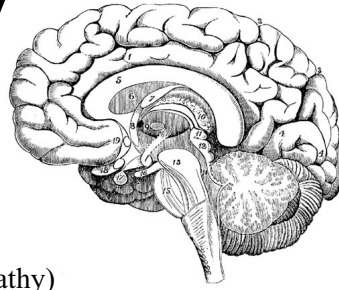


Super Sunday

caused by repeated concussions. One notable quote from the film:

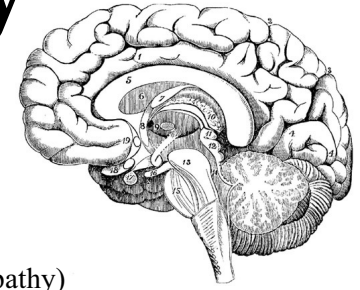
**“The NFL owns one day of the week;
