## CHAPTER 1

#### WHY PARENTS?

Every person has or has had parents. Why has God chosen in His infinite wisdom to give each person (except Adam and Eve--Luke 3:38) a mother and father? Are parents given merely to bring children into the world or are there other important reasons why parents are needed?

Parents are needed



There are at least seven reasons why God has blessed humanity with parents (and parents are meant to be a BLESSING, not a CURSE):

## 1) PARENTS ARE TO PROVIDE.

Children depend on the provision which comes from their parents. Human children need the care and provision of their parents <u>much longer</u> than the members of the animal kingdom. For example, a kangaroo baby (called a "joey") leaves the mother's pouch after 10 months and after 8 more months leaves the mother. Bear cubs are almost ready to leave mother at age two.

Ducks, chicken and geese can see and walk and care for themselves soon after they hatch. A baby flamingo leaves its nest 3 or 4 hours after it hatches (aren't you glad your parents did not send you out of the home so early!). Most reptile mothers (turtles and snakes) just lay their eggs and leave. Their mothers never see them hatch and as soon as they break through the shell they are on their own.

should care for their own family and thus repay or make return to their parents
For all the care they received when young).

# 2) PARENTS ARE TO PROTECT.

Note: The one primarily responsible for protecting and providing is the FATHER. Very often in the Bible, the people who are to be the most pitied and the ones whom believers should reach out to in compassion and mercy are the FATHERLESS and WIDOWS (those who have no father and those who have no husband). This shows the important place the man (Father-Husband) has in the family. See James 1:27; Isaiah 1:17; Jeremiah 7:6-7; Zechariah 7:9-10; etc.

### 3) PARENTS ARE TO DISCIPLINE.

In Ephesians 6:4 the Father is told to bring up his children in the nurture (DISCIPLINE) and admonition of the Lord. The Bible says that we have had fathers of our flesh (earthly fathers) which disciplined, corrected and spanked us (Hebrews 12:9). Who cares enough about you to spank you—your parents or your next-door neighbor (Compare Heb. 12:7-8)?

Is discipline and spanking an evidence of the parent's hatred for the child (Proverbs 13:24 and compare Hebrews 12:6)?

The parent should love the child so much that he or she cannot and must not allow the child to do what is wrong or to go in a crooked way.

# 4) PARENTS ARE TO TRAIN AND INSTRUCT.

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What are the 2 basic duties of children?
1. Ephesians 6:1; Colossians 3:20
2. Ephesians 6:2; Exodus 20:12 (respect)

Those who do not learn to obey and respect their parents will have
great difficulty in learning to do the same with God. Building an obedient and
